

As scientists, we will learn about classification and the work of Carl Linnaeus. Key vocabulary will include:

vertebrate, invertebrate, taxonomy, microorganism, species and genus. We will also develop our skills of scientific enquiry when working with light and reflection.

Key vocabulary will include: reflection, refraction and electromagnetic spectrum

As musicians, we will listen to a range of pieces, identifying their composition, pitch and texture.

Children will also compose their own short pieces of music.



In RSHE, children will learn about families, relationships, health and wellbeing. This will include study of respectful relationships, resolving conflict and emotional resilience.



As linguists, we will be learning to read, write, listen and speak about pets - and monsters - in French.



As **explorers**, in geography we will discover what life is like in the Alps, including where they can be found and how they are different from our local area. Geographical skills: locational knowledge, place

knowledge, human and physical geography. Fieldwork: how could the local area be improved?



Our Writing Roots from Literacy Tree will be 'The Man Who Walked Between the Towers' and 'The Tempest'. Our Literacy Leaves will be 'The Good Thieves' and 'The Explorer' - both by Katherine Rundell. These high-quality books, alongside books from our reading spine, will be the focus of our English lessons including writing, grammar, punctuation and spelling.
